
From the Prez: Alex KD6LPA

BATTERIES and AIR TRAVEL NEW RULES

To help reduce the risk of fires, air travelers will no longer be able to pack loose lithium batteries in checked luggage as of January 1. Passengers can still check baggage with lithium batteries if they are installed in electronic devices such as cameras, cell phones, laptop computers, and radios If packed in plastic bags batteries may be in carryon baggage. The limit is two batteries per passenger. The ban affects shipments of non-rechargeable lithium batteries, such as Energizer and Duracell brands.

"Doing something as simple as keeping a spare battery in its original retail packaging or a plastic zip-lock bag will prevent unintentional short-circuiting and fires," Krista Edwards, deputy administrator of the Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safely Administration, said in a release. The Federal Aviation Administration has found that fire-protection systems in the cargo hold of passenger planes cannot put out fires sparked in lithium batteries.
