January Guest Speaker

Arnold Shatz, M.D., N6HC

Subject: Midway Island, K4M, October 2009

First licensed in 1957, and known as "N6 Hotel California" since 1977. Arnie is the Vice-President of the Southern California DX Club (SCDXC), a member of the Chiltern DX Club in the UK, Southern California Contest Club (SCCC) and Orange County Amateur Radio Club. A ARRL member for more than 50-years. His achievements include 8-band DXCC and the



DXCC Honor Roll. Arnie enjoys chasing DX and participating in radiosport events using CW, SSB and RTTY modes.

Arnie will share with us the pictures and stories of the DXpedition to Midway Island (KH4), using the special callsign of "K4M". Midway, made famous in the period after the bombing of Pearl Harbor in 1942. Located northwest of Honolulu, at about mid-way to Japan, this Island played a critical role in the Pacific action during WWII. Now the Island is off limits except to special permitting by the Department of Fish and Wild Life Services, making it a rare spot in the mid Pacific Ocean. By its unique location, and restricted access, the DXpedition to Midway produced 61077 2-way contacts. Most of the contacts were to North America (28,751) and on 20-meters (16544). 18,465 unique call signs were logged by the K4M operators. Join us in welcoming Dr. Arnie back to the South Bay club for another presentation. His last presentation was about the Clipperton Island DXPedition, TX5C.




