that little maneuver.





March speaker:

If you missed last month's meeting, you missed a good one. Our very own Chuck Lobb - KN6H gave a presentation on the history of the Torrance Airport and its role in the training of fighter pilots during World War II. Chuck has done hundreds of hours of research on the topic. He has attempted to contact every pilot that was stationed at the Torrance Airport which began its life as the Lomita Flight strip during World War II. His research began in 1994 when the Torrance Air fair was planning a celebration of the 50th anniversary of D-Dav in Normandy. He wasn't able to find much from local sources including local military facilities, so he contacted the Air Force repository for history and got many records. From there the research got its start.

Pilots at the Lomita Flight Strip trained on P-38 Lightings, a 2 engine fighter, used in the pacific and in 1943 and early 1945 in Europe. Pilots who arrived in Torrance had already been through flight school and flight training in a number of training aircraft. Torrance was their last training stop before being deployed in Europe

Chuck showed how the Lomita flight strip evolved in different stages from low lying farmland to an airstrip with a wartime mission, then to post war business and then general aviation hub.

Chuck was able to sell a number of his books and DVDs after his presentation. His presentation was warmly received. Thanks Chuck!
