What is Logbook of The World? - from ARRL

Logbook of The World - *LoTW* - is an exciting way for Radio Amateurs to confirm two-way contacts they have made and use the confirmations as credit toward various awards.

Because Logbook of The World uses double blind comparison, users cannot see what other users have uploaded unless there is a matched QSO. All files uploaded to LoTW are electronically signed by verified users. Logbook of The World maintains the integrity of the QSO verification process that has long been the hallmark of ARRL awards.

www.arrl.org The American Radio Relay League website. This contains lots of information about what's going on in the hobby. Info on how to get licensed, where to take tests, and the actual question pool are found here. ARRL sponsored contests are listed, amateur band plans, public service and ARES (Amatuer Radio Emergency Service) information is also found here. Lots of "how to" articles are posted, and ARRL members have access to digital copies of past issues of ARRL monthly publications.

www.eham.net Eham.net is a very good site for keeping up with the online ham community. Lots of user provided content and discussion threads about a variety of topics including equipment and emergency communications. Clicking the tab on the left side marked "Reviews" will bring you to a large menu of equipment review topics where users of listed equipment, software, and services provide their own subjective reviews and ratings from 1-5 (1 worst, 5 best) for that item. If you are considering buying anything ham related, check here first and read any reviews about it. One caution: do not just use the posted reviews as your only criteria for buying or not buying something. Ask some of your local fellow hams too.

http://ac6v.com/ This site is simply the best source of information about nearly everything ham. This is the "clearinghouse" I mentioned but also has tons of it's own content. The top of the site says "700 amateur radio topics, 6,000 links, 132 pages". Rod, the site owner, passed away last year, but somebody obviously cares enough to keep his site online. I worked him once on 6-meters and he was such a gentleman! Articles Rod has written abound here with lots of links to more offsite resources. His main index is huge and contains articles on working satellites, what GMT means, equipment, DX'ing, homebrew, radio astronomy, and more. Rod has written several books for beginners including DX'ing and 6-meters. You must bookmark this site!

www.contesting.com This is a huge website dedicated to amateur radio contesting. If you ever wanted to know something about an upcoming contest or what it's all about, this is the place.

www.kkn.net/n6aa/ This is currently the offical website of the ARRL Southwest Division. This is where you can find information about our division and the people who make-up the division staff who serve us.

www.freqofnature.com In my opinion, this is the best scanner enthusiast & frequency website in the West. Plenty of up-todate info on frequencies for public service agencies as well as for special events like the Rose Parade and Oscars. VHF/UHF aviation frequencies and air show stuff is posted here too. If you enjoy monitoring or are looking for info on a particular scanner, this is the place. The website owner is a ham from the Simi Valley area. They also have a discussion board with a variety of topics.

www.qrz.com Most hams are familiar with this website, but some non-hams are too for one big reason: QRZ posts sample ham exams a study guide. This is the first place that I send non-hams who want to get licensed, followed by the above two websites. QRZ is similar to eham with tons of user provided news & views.

How to get signed on to Facebook

Go to FACEBOOK.com.

Enter your First Name, Last Name, Email, and the password you wish to use for Facebook.

You also have to enter your Gender and a birthday. Note that you do not have to let anyone see your birthday if you choose not to. This can be set up either way in 'preferences' later.

Once you hit enter, you will be asked to let Facebook do a search for your friends. This is primarily giving Facebook temporary permission to scan your email accounts on other networks. Your Google, Windows Live, Yahoo! and possibly other email accounts you have are available for scanning. Facebook tries to match the email for a given person to the email address you have for them in your system. Sometimes this works, and sometimes it does not. It all depends on the email address you have for a given individual. Know that this is not a requirement, but it can let you know that there are people in your address book that are on Facebook already.

Next, Facebook will ask for some information to fill out your profile. Again, this is optional and you may skip it if you want.

The next step is one where you may set up a photo of yourself for your profile. You can either upload a photo or even take one of yourself with a web-cam, if you have one. You may skip this also, if you wish.

Once you hit enter, you will be presented with your Facebook home page. You will need to complete one last step to confirm your account: Facebook asks that you confirm the email address you used and asks you to checkthat account for a message from them to confirm that you are who you say you are.

Once you have done all this, you are dropped back to your home page in Facebook and allowed to once again perform any of the steps you may have skipped previously. You now have a 'Profile' in Facebook. At this point, you can search for 'W6SBA' to join the Club's Facebook page.

If you just want to search for friends manually, you can do so, but the biggest catch to it is that you will soon find that there may be multiple individuals with the same name as the friends you are searching for. This is why Facebook asks you to let it search your emails for matches out there. This hurdle has stumped me a few times and I usually resort to other means of identifying a friend. Eventually, you will find a someone in common and it may turn out that the friend you were looking for is in that person's friend list. Many times you will find that these 'connections' will help you find an elusive contact.

An important note or two.... Facebook has been in the news lately with its lack of communication to users concerning its privacy policies/settings. There are at least a few users in the club who are familiar with the ins and outs of Facebook and will be glad to help set you up – all you need to do is ask, myself among them.

I have to say this: You do need to be conscious of what Facebook is – and what it is not. Facebook is a Social Network (yup, just like the movie) and is driven by individuals who are willing to allow connections. Once you become active on Facebook, you will want to look into Facebook preferences for privacy – you can adjust many aspects of the network and how you connect with it. There are actions you can take to limit your exposure.

Lastly, Facebook provides the opportunity to 'like' things. You'll find everything to 'like' on Facebook. From Astronauts to Zebras (I checked this before I wrote it). This also allows many legitimate companies to put their face out there too. It's all about marketing, and you can be notified when there is an update to their product page. You may get in on the ground floor of a sale that has not hit the presses yet. But either way, anything you click on in Facebook can end up being a big 'Journey to Ernie.' Time will slip away as you find yourself building a farm or even fighting the Mafia. You may learn why you heard sirens last night, or what's happening down at the pier today, or you may soon learn that you had long lost cousins in another part of the world. But one thing you won't find on Facebook, is boredom. - Mike, KI6LJM
