About the Speaker:

Licensed for 41 years and an ARRL Life member, Dave has focused on VHF through microwave Amateur Radio communications since 1968. He built one of the first solid-state 2 meter (AM) transceivers in Southern California in 1969. He built his first of three VHF and UHF FM Repeaters in 1972 on 224.28 MHz and the same repeater is still operational today on that frequency (PL - 107.2 Hz). His 445.5000 MHz Repeater and his 1283.9000 repeaters have been operational sine 1985. Dave's first 10 GHz SSB/CW Transceiver was featured in the ARRL - Microwave Update conference and proceedings in 1991, followed by his Microwave PLL system in 1995 and is featured on his web page at www.wa6cgr.com. He has spoken on Amateur Radio Microwave Communications at several ARRL SW Division Conventions and at Amateur Radio Clubs accross Southern California. Presently he is working on a new Patent design for a Polarimetric Wind Turbine to generate electricity from the wind. He is a member of several Renewable Energy associations such as the American Wind Power Association and the worked with the California Energy Commission to certify Vertical Axis Wind Turbines for PacWind, Inc. where he was recently the Chief Technology Officer.


