Hardware requirements

Pentium II or better PC, one or more serial ports, an interface circuit for the PTT Software requirements,

RTTY/SSTV - JE3HHT has

provided easy to use software for RTTY and SSTV. MMTTY and MMSSTV that will decode and encode signals using the PC Sound Card. Together with a simple interface, you can be up and running on Teletype or Slow Scan TV.

<u>Packet</u> - Another excellent program is SV2AGW sound card (software TNC) program called AGWPE, or SV2(AGW) (P)acket (E)ngine. By using the DSP in the PC sound card, AGWPE has the ability to encode and decode 300b, 1200b, 2400b and 9600b packet signals. AGWPE sound card application appear to give better results then most hardware TNCs.

<u>PSK31</u> - Radio Teletype mode has been enhanced with a new format, Phase Shift Keying 31 baud (PSK31). This newer form of modulation offers a higher level of performance for the keyboard-to-keyboard QSO. There are many PSK31 programs on the internet. One I like is "PSK31Deluxe" and another is "WinWabler."

<u>APRS</u> - is a system developed by WA4APR, which uses amateur radio to transmit position reports, weather reports, and messages between users.

<u>Integrated Software</u> - There are many communications interface programs that provide either a single mode, like "UI-View" for APRS tracking, "HamScope" for PSK31(QPSK), RTTY, ASCII, MFSK16, Packet and CW. Ham Radio Deluxe (HRD) for PSK31, Radio Control and logging.

<u>User Interface</u> Panoramic display, Radio/CAT control of the newer transceivers, programmable buttons and user defined function keys.

New PC's without Serial Ports New PC's often come with USB ports, and NO COM ports. Stores like Radio Shack, CompUSA or Best Buy all carry USB-Serial Converters. You can also find these devices on the Internet. Checkout on-line stores like microHAM and West Mountain Radio for software devices.

<u>Download</u> Search the internet for the following subjects: MMTTY, MMSSTV (engine), AGWPE, UI-View, HamScope and HRD, and join us at the next SBARC meeting to see how easy these programs are to install and use.

VANITY CALL SIGN FEE TO DROP SEPTEMBER 6, 2006

The regulatory fee to obtain or renew an Amateur Radio vanity call sign will drop slightly starting with applications received by the FCC on or after Wednesday, September 6, the FCC's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (WTB) said this week. The new fee will be \$20.80 for the 10-year license term.

This year promises to be a big one for vanity call sign renewals, since the initial round of vanity grants under the current system occurred in 1996. Licensees who want to retain vanity call signs issued under the current (post-1995) system must pay the regulatory fee when renewing. "Consistent with our established practice, we plan to collect these regulatory fees in the August-September 2006 time frame in order to collect the required amount by the end of the fiscal year," the FCC explained in a July 17 Report and Order (R&O), "Assessment and Collection of Regulatory Fees for Fiscal Year 2006," in MD Docket 06-68. The FY 2006 vanity fee is a bit higher than the \$20.10 for the license term that the Commission had proposed in a Notice of Proposed Rule Making last March. The current vanity call sign fee of \$21.90 remains in effect for applications received by the FCC before September 6. Amateur Radio licensees may file renewal applications no sooner than 90 days of their license expiration date. While the regulatory fee payment is required from licensees wishing to keep their current vanity call signs after renewal, vanity holders can opt to get a sequential call sign and avoid paying any fee when they renew.

ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, says the

FCC has been handling vanity call sign license renewals from June without any delay or problems. "I'm sure Gate 2 will go just as smoothly if you use one of the automated methods of filing, such as via the ARRL or using the Universal Licensing System(ULS)," she predicted. "Paper filings to the FCC can be confusing and difficult." The FCC renewed nearly 3000 vanity call sign licenses during June and July.

Amateur Radio licensees holding vanity call signs granted prior to 1996 do not have to pay a regulatory fee when renewing. This is because Congress did not begin requiring the FCC to annually recover its regulatory costs until 1993. Additionally, such licensees are not specifically tagged as vanity call sign holders in the ULS.

The ARRL VEC will process license renewals for vanity call sign holders for a modest fee. The service is available to ARRL members and nonmembers, although League members pay less. Routine, non-vanity renewals continue to be free for ARRL members. Trustees of club stations with vanity call signs may renew either via the ULS or through a Club Station Call Sign Administrator, such as ARRL VEC. Somma says the ARRL's new license renewal/modification Web pages http://www.arrl.org/fcc/memberlicenseinstructions.html contain complete information on license-filing procedures, including step-by-step instructions on how to renew or update a license using the ULS<http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/>

FCC SUSPENDS HAM LICENSES FOR FAILURE TO MAINTAIN MAILING ADDRESS

The FCC has suspended two Amateur Radio licenses because the holders had failed to maintain correct mailing addresses in the Commission's licensee database. Special Counsel in the FCC Spectrum Enforcement Division Riley Hollingsworth wrote two operators on June 28 to inform them the FCC was suspending their Technician tickets for the remainder of their license terms or until each licensee provides a valid mailing address.

In his letter to Smith, Hollingsworth noted that on three occasions in late 2005, the FCC had been unable to deliver warning notices alleging deliberate interference to a 2-meter repeater system. He told one operator that the US Postal Service earlier this year returned as, undeliverable two warning notices alleging deliberate interference with several repeaters.

Hollingsworth cited §97.23 of the Commission's Amateur

Radio Service rules that requires each license grant to show the licensee's correct name and mailing address. The rule provides that "revocation of the station license or suspension of the operator license may result when correspondence from the FCC is returned as undeliverable because the grantee failed to provide the correct mailing address."

In several other failure-to-reply cases, Hollingsworth notified the operators that their license renewal application has been designated for dismissal.

Ray - WA6OWM, will be giving a super talk at the August meeting - on using the sound card audio in place of a TNC to do packet and APRS.


