





CALIFORNIA QSO PARTY

46th Running Of The CQP! October 6-7, 2012 1600 UTC Oct 6 to 2200 UTC Oct 7

The California QSO Party is planned for the first weekend in October. WA6OWM - Ray will layout the how's and do's in preparing and operating this contest. Unlike Field Day, we, the California stations are the desire of the amateur world. Phone contacts are in the first 30-minutes and CW in the second 30-minutes.

Objective:

Stations outside of CA work as many CA Stations in as many CA Counties (58) as possible. Stations in CA work everyone.

Exchange:

CA stations send QSO-Number (starting with 001) and a 4-digit CA County CA stations log the 4-digit CA county or 2-digit State(50), Provinces, and DX

Bands:

160, 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2 Meters

CW - 1815 and 40kHz up from the band edge

Phone - 1.845, 3.850, 7.230, 14.250, 21.300, 28.450, 50.135, 144.210 MHz Try - 50.125/144.200MHz Calling frequency and then QSY 160M - at 0500UTC 80/75 - 0300 and 0700UTC

No CW contacts in the Phone bands except 160M

Operate from Home, or a temporary site, using temporary antenna supports. Mobile, School, Novice/Technician Station, with a Novice/Technician call sign. YL Operator, Youth Operator, New Contester and Club Competition. Free logging software available. Certificates for all entries, 38 Special Plaques. Top 20 CA and outside California receive a bottle of wine from NCCC Private Reserve.

Must be present at the August meeting to get all the secrets to improving your Field Day experience by operating in CQP!
