

"Elmering" is available to every member, please ask any officer, and we will find a knowledgeable club resource for you.



Fellow Ham Enthusiasts,

You'll definitely want to check out the ARDUINO. It is especially popular with hobbyists of all kinds and allows you to create specialized electronic projects, starting at just \$29.

The Arduino is an "open-source electronics platform" that's easy to use and program for all types of interesting tasks.

The Arduino can be used to control lights, motors, or other actuators, even sound devices! Maybe you want to create a hidden transmitter. With this device, you could develop a circuit to play a WAVE file every 15 minutes as part of a Direction Finding exercise. The possibilities are literally endless.



The Arduino also has other accessories available including BlueTooth, USB, and conventional RS-232 serial devices that can connect to the basic circuit shown above.

One person, actually created a circuit that will listen for the "Secret Knock" on a door, and automatically open the lock once it hears the correct rhythm. It's absolutely amazing. Check out the video at: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zE5PGeh2K9k and I'm sure you'll be quite impressed.
